- We have the software Therap to help with daily data and Progress notes.
- We continue to be members of ADDP and Providers Council
- We continued our membership with the Mass Health Coalition
- We have done an internal reorganization of our management structure, and have hired a new Program Director, new Operations Coordinator and new Project Director for Day Habilitation. We also created a new position that focuses on our transportation and IT needs.
- In May we held our Annual meeting and handed out awards for employee of the year, employer of the year, growth in independence and job coach of the year. Others were recognized for long term employment with ASA and individuals who have long term employment.
- We held our annual Thanksgiving Celebration and we were grateful for Boston Market for catering.
